On behalf of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) Space Science Days program, the International Ultraviolet Association (IUVA), and the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers, I would like to invite you to attend an educational workshop designed to inspire and broaden your knowledge about space science.
